**AN ORDINANCE ASSENTING TO THE REZONING OF THE PROPERTY HEREIN DESCRIBED, AND
TO AMEND THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP
OF THE CITY OF PICKENS, SOUTH CAROLINA**

Whereas, the City of Pickens has adopted an Official Zoning Ordinance in accordance with South Carolina State Enabling Legislation, as included in Title VI, Chapter 29 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, for the purpose of promoting the public health, safety, and general welfare of the community; and

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Pickens realizes the need to update the Zoning Map for the City of Pickens when rezoning requests occur; and

Whereas, the City of Pickens Official Zoning Map, Zoning Ordinance, and Future Land Use Map will be used to guide land use decision making and the long-range development of the City; and

Whereas, the City of Pickens has recommended to the Planning Commission a rezoning for the parcel listed below, requesting the property be rezoned from R12 (residential) to R8 (residential); and

Whereas, on May 9th, 2023, the Planning Commission considered the request in accordance with the current Official Zoning Map and the Future Land Use Map, and recommends the Pickens City Council adopt the rezoning of the parcel set forth herein and to amend the City of Pickens' Official Zoning Map to reflect these changes.

Now Therefore, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Pickens, South Carolina that:

Section 1—The Council of the City of Pickens, South Carolina, finds and declares as the legislative body of the City that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City to rezone the following parcels listed below from R12 to R8.:

1. Parcel # 4181-12-85-0937 located at 160 Glassy Mountain Street
2. Parcel # 4181-12-85-1929 located at 306 East Baker Street
3. Parcel # 4181-12-86-2010 located at 312 East Baker Street
4. Parcel # 4181-12-86-3073 located at 314 East Baker Street
5. Parcel # 4181-12-86-5026 located at 326 East Baker Street
6. Parcel # 4181-12-86-6007 located on East Baker Street

Section 2—the parcel described in this Ordinance shall be rezoned upon final approval of this Ordinance as set forth herein, and the Official Zoning Map shall be amended to reflect these changes.

RE: Overview of Emergency Services during Donald Trump Rally in Pickens, SC

- Fire- (3) Engine Companies, (1) Ladder Company, (1) UTV were staffed for the event. Only fire event during operational period was one of the medical carts had a small fire near the battery for the pump. It was extinguished with a fire extinguisher and cart was able to continue to be used. Landing Zone was established and maintained through the event.
- Haz-Mat- (2) Haz-mat trucks on site and setup decon station. Decon was not needed.
- Medical- (6) 2-person walking teams, (4) ALS Medical Carts, (2) ALS QRVs, (4) ALS Transport Ambulances and Medical Treatment bus were initially on-site. During event we had to add another ALS Medical Cart, ALS QRV and (4) additional Ambulances due to number of calls. We had (1) Air-Transport Unit (ATU) that was on the ground for the event. (1) Non-medical cooling shelter was in place and second cooling shelter had to be opened during the event. Medical had a very busy day. The National Weather Service was setup in the EOC and reported the heat index reached 108F during the event. We had a great plan to record patient contacts through ICS 214 Form, but due to the number of patients, that process was abandoned at 1348. Dispatched continued to keep a CAD log of the calls they received, but that does not account for patients field teams may have encountered and just moved to a cooler area. Three additional cooling locations were established on Main Street, behind the stage, in front of the Court House, and inside the Burning Brick.
 - Severe Calls
 - Cardiac Arrest – Patient was found in V-fib, defibrillated x3 and pulse regained. Pt transported to AnMed Health Cannon by ground, later transferred to Prisma GHS for higher level of care.
 - Stroke- New onset stroke like symptoms, pt taken by ATU to Prisma GHS.
 - Anaphylactic Reaction – Taken by ground to AnMed Health Cannon.
 - Numbers
 - Transports to Hospital – 20
 - Treated and Released from Mobile Treatment Room – 48
 - Known medical patients 152, suspect around 400
 - Non-Medical Cooling saw approximately 150

(2) additional pallets taken to stage area and (2) additional taken to Court Street. Ran out of finger lancets (obtained from EMS supply room) and ice packs (obtained from AnMed Health Cannon and Wal-Mart). (1) 800mhz walkie stopped working. Breakfast and Lunch for 250 were provided.

MONTHLY REPORT JUNE 2023

SUMMARY: The month of June was a transitional month with our schools not in regular session but continuing with several camps and outreach programs that required our SRO's to be present. June was a particularly heavy community outreach month with our annual "Goats on the Run" scavenger hunt. We also conducted a community event with the Fire Dept. and had a "Pup Up Splash Pad" and popsicle event at Jaycee Park. We continue to dedicate hours toward our homeless population and mental health issues in the community. Narcotics enforcement at both a street level and investigative level is ongoing, and our K-9 Detection Program continues to be a success. A substantial portion of the month was also dedicated to event planning for the July 1 Independence Day Celebration and the visit of a former President of the United States.

TRAFFIC: We continue to receive complaints in regard to speeding and loud vehicles. The traffic ticket count for the month was 167. A review of CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch) indicates that for every citation we average 9 vehicles stops. Although each traffic stop does not result in a citation, officers are dedicating attention to traffic enforcement. Speed complaints continue to come from roads/streets that come into and out of the city as well as Main Street. The total citation count for 2023 is 967. We have investigated 98 motor vehicle accidents in 2023 that include accidents that occur on private property such as parking lots. We have no fatalities to report. Accident scene management would be impossible if not for the response by the Fire Department as they are an integral part of controlling our crash sites allowing us to clear the roadway and provide safety for officers and motorists.

ENFORCMENT: We have made 532 arrests in 2023. Narcotics and narcotics related crimes remain high. We have had several pursuits and use of force incidents with no injuries and no complaints. There has been a rise in shoplifting incidents, the

majority coming from Wal mart. Simple assaults and domestic violence have had a slight increase, however, there have been no serious or life threatening injuries reported. Our total reporting has risen from 852 at this point last year, to 1290 this year. Our call volume/recorded case numbers at the end of June were 4038 which represents 22.3 calls/ case numbers per day. This number does not capture the hours spent on patrol, citizen contacts, business contacts and time dedicated to report writing.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH: The annual Goats on the Run scavenger hunt took place for three weeks in June. Hundreds of young people and their families participated and our partnerships with businesses such as the Pedal'n Shak, Moos' Creamery and Premier Supermercado made the event a success. The Pop up Splash Pad and popsicle event with the Fire Dept. was well attended.

ADMINISTRATION: A vast portion of the month was dedicated towards event planning for community outreach and the Main Street Event. The Pickens Police Department had a two day SLED/South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy Audit of State mandated polices. Minor revisions were suggested by the SCCJA which were completed and provided to the State. We completed an internal audit of active warrants for accurate NCIC entry and accurate hard files of the warrants. We also completed an Evidence Room audit to remove and purge evidence in cases that had been adjudicated with no requirement for evidence retention. Training and Field Training continued with over 250 hours of training being completed in June.
